OBJECTIVES

- To develop a responsive and accountable attitude among the stakeholders, thereby maintaining a harmonious atmosphere in the University campus:
- · To ensure that grievances are resolved promptly, objectively and with sensitivity and in complete confidentiality:
- To ensure that the views of each grievant and respondent are respected and that any party to a grievance is neither discriminated against nor victimized;

FUNCTIONS

- To provide effective advocacy to stakeholders so that they can communicate their issues freely and honestly without fear of being victimized;
 - To investigate and conduct official hearings on the merits of grievance.
- To respect the privacy and confidentiality of all parties during the inquiry, in accordance with and subject to the policy guidelines;
- To obtain the facts through relevant & credible sources in a fair and objective manner. To establish structured interactions with students to elicit information on their expectations.

GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL MECHANISM

STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE (SOP)

Any student or parent who wants to initiate a grievance may, in the first instance, bring the issue to the notice of the Head of the respective school / department / office, who will address the issue and try to resolve it within 10 working days of the receipt of the grievance.

I. FORMAL REGISTRATION: Any aggrieved student or parent or staff member with a genuine grievance will submit his/her Grievance in writing along with necessary documents, if any, through any of the following modes;

Sending via e-mail at <u>bvbc_grc@bvbdelhi.org</u> OR

Submitting a signed hard copy of the grievance complaint, in person to the Teacher In charge of Grievance Redressal Cell.

- II. ACKNOWLEDGEMENT: The Grievance Redressal Cell shall acknowledge the receipt of each grievance complainant immediately. In the case of e-mail at bvbc_grc@bvbdelhi.org the sender will receive a reply acknowledging the receipt of his/her e-mail.
- III. FORWARDING: Upon receipt of grievance, the Grievance Redressal Cell shall categories, analyze the merits of the grievance, and forward the grievance to the respective school / department / office / individual (dealing with the substantive function linked with the grievance) requesting them to enquire into the grievance and redress within such period as may be specified, in a time not exceeding 7 days from the receipt of grievance
- IV. SCRUITINY: Grievance Redressal Committee will make a thorough review of the redressal process. In case the committee feels satisfied with the resolution provided by the respective school / department / office / individual, then it will intimate the same to the grievant.
- V. FINAL DECISION: After the hearing or investigation, the Grievance Redressal Committee shall use its best efforts to work out a resolution of the issues involved with the parties named in the grievance application pass an order indicating the reasons for such order, as may be deemed fit.
- VI. CLOSURE OF COMPLAINT: The complaint shall be considered as disposed of and closed when

The grievant has indicated acceptance of resolution

• The grievant has not responded within four weeks from the date of receipt of information on resolution. The proceeding concerning each grievance will be recorded in a systematic manner. The information relating to the proceedings shall be treated as confidential and can be viewed only by the members of the Grievance Redressal Committee, for the purpose of investigation.

DOCUMENTATION: The information relating to the proceedings of grievances VII. shall be treated as confidential and can be viewed only by the members of Grievance Redressal Committee, for the purpose of investigation.

PROCEDURE OF FORMATION OF GRC

The committee has been formed through following process:

1. For nominated members- Group discussion & one on one Q-A round was taken up with all the students who were interested in being a part of GRC. Case-based study questions were given to them to judge their fair decision-making skills. 





CAMBRIDGE ENGLISH EDUCATIONAL PARTNER AGREEMENT

This Agreement is dated

12th February 2025

Parties

- (1) THE CHANCELLOR, MASTERS, AND SCHOLARS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE acting through its department, Cambridge University Press & Assessment whose principal office is at Shaftesbury Road, Cambridge, CB2 8EA, UK (Cambridge); and
- (2) Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Delhi Kendra, Kasturba Gandhi Marg, New Delhi 110001, India (the Institution).

BACKGROUND

- (A) The Institution wishes to become a Cambridge English Educational Partner.
- (B) Cambridge agrees to provide the Institution the Promotional Benefits of being part of the Cambridge English Educational Partner Scheme on the terms set out in this Agreement.

Agreed terms

1. Interpretation

The following definitions and rules of interpretation apply in this Agreement.

1.1 Definitions:

Business Plan Document: a joint business plan agreed between the parties for the duration of this Agreement setting out the strategic objectives and Promotional Benefits the Institution is eligible for as a Cambridge English Educational Partner.

Cambridge Materials: the materials provided to Institution by Cambridge from time to time in any format and any intellectual property rights of Cambridge that is owned, licensed or otherwise proprietary to Cambridge and was conceived, created or developed prior to or independent of the commencement of this Agreement.

Confidential Information: any information, however conveyed or presented, that relates to the business, affairs, operations, customers, processes, budgets, pricing policies, product information, strategies, developments, trade secrets, know-how, methods, technology, technical data, personnel and suppliers of the disclosing Party, together with all information derived by the receiving Party from any such information and any other information clearly designated by a Party as being confidential to it (whether or not it is marked 'confidential'), or which ought reasonably be considered to be confidential, and information concerning a Party's relationships with actual or potential clients, customers, suppliers and the needs and requirements of such persons.

Designation: means the designation 'Cambridge English Educational Partner', which shall always be used in its complete form and shall not be abbreviated or otherwise altered.

Logo: means the Cambridge English Educational Partner logo, as provided in Schedule 1.

Logo Guidelines: Cambridge's logo guidelines provided by Cambridge to the Institution as may be amended from time to time.

Promotional Benefits: a wide range of benefits, initiatives, and support provided by Cambridge to the Institution as detailed in Business Plan Document depending on the territory in which the Institution operates in as may be updated by Cambridge from time to time.

Commencement and duration

- 2.1 This Agreement shall commence on the date when it has been signed by all parties and shall continue, unless terminated earlier in accordance with clause 7, until the third anniversary of the commencement of this Agreement when it shall terminate automatically without notice.
- The parties may agree in writing to extend the term of this Agreement including the duration and terms of the extension.

3. Confidentiality

- 3.1 Neither party shall disclose to any person, other than their own employees, officers, directors or agents having a reasonable need to know same (and those of their affiliated companies), any Confidential Information that has been disclosed to it by the other party, directly or indirectly, nor use same in any way either during the term of this Agreement or at any time thereafter without the express written authority of the other party, and to promptly return all Confidential Information on termination of this Agreement and on written request by the other party.
- 3.2 This clause will survive the expiry or termination of this Agreement.

4. Cambridge English Educational Partner Scheme

4.1 The Institution will adopt Cambridge course materials and/ or examinations to achieve the following minimum requirements:

- 4.2 Subject to the Institution meeting the requirements under clause 4.1 and complying with its obligations under this Agreement, Cambridge:
 - (a) agrees to provide the Institution the Promotional Benefits;

- (b) hereby grants a non-exclusive, non- transferable, revocable licence for the duration of this Agreement to use:
 - (i) the Designation; and
 - (ii) the Logo
- 4.3 The licences granted to the Institution under clause 4.2(b) are personal to the Institution and may not be transferred, sold, passed to or otherwise shared with a third party without the express written consent of Cambridge.
- Permitted Uses of the Designation and Logo
- 5.1 The Institution shall be entitled to use the Designation and/or Logo subject to the following terms and conditions:
 - (a) The Designation and/or Logo may only be used in connection with the Institution's use of Cambridge Materials and Cambridge Exams in its English language teaching programme (the Programme);
 - (b) The Institution may only use the Logo in accordance with the Logo guidelines and for the following applications:
 - on publicity documents and other promotional material relating to the Programme;
 - (ii) on press advertising that relates specifically to the Programme;
 - (iii) on web pages that relate specifically to the Programme;
 - (iv) on administrative material relating specifically to the Programme, or to Cambridge, or
 - (v) on promotional goods (e.g. pens, pencils, mugs, etc.) associated with the Programme, provided that such items are given away and not sold, and are of appropriate quality and consistent with Cambridge's brand and image, subject at all times to prior written approval from Cambridge of the proposed use.

in each case provided such uses strictly relate to the adoption, sale and /or promotion of the Cambridge Materials or otherwise reference Cambridge. No other uses of the Logo are permitted.

- 5.2 The Logo must be used in the format and proportions shown in Schedule 1, in accordance with any guidelines or instructions Cambridge provides and each reproduction of the Logo must include Designation.
- 5.3 The Institution must not use a copy of the Logo derived from any other source.
- 5.4 The uses detailed in clause 5.1(b) above are permitted subject at all times to the condition that the use in question does not state or imply endorsement by Cambridge of the Institution's

other activities, including but without limitation approval of the quality of teaching or other services provided by the Institution.

5.5 Upon expiry or termination of this Agreement, the Institution shall immediately cease use of the Designation and the Logo and shall remove all existing uses of the Designation and Logo, including from its materials, systems and records.

Prohibited Uses of the Designation and Logo

- 6.1 Use of the Logo for any of the following applications is expressly prohibited:
 - (a) on any certificate, invoice or other financial document;
 - (b) on letterhead, business cards or other stationery;
 - (c) as part of an e-mail template or in any other electronic form other than as part of a web page as described in subsection 5.1(b) above.
- 6.2 The Institution warrants, undertakes and agrees that:
 - it will use the Logo and Designation in such a manner that their distinctiveness and reputation is maintained and do nothing which may bring Cambridge into disrepute;
 - (b) it will not do or permit to be done any act which would be likely to Jeopardise the ownership by Cambridge of the Logo, including by using them as part of the name or logo of the Institution including in the manner described in clause 6;
 - (c) it will not use or seek to register any mark or name the same or confusingly similar to the Cambridge Logo; and
 - (d) all goodwill in the Cambridge Logo arising from use of the Cambridge Logo and/or the Designation shall belong to Cambridge and shall be assigned to Cambridge on request.

7. Termination

- 7.1 Cambridge shall have the right at any time to terminate this Agreement immediately by giving written notice to the Institution in the event that it:
 - it commits a material breach of any of its obligations under this Agreement and shall not have remedied such breach (if capable of remedy) within fourteen (14) days of being required by Cambridge to remedy the breach by notice in writing;
 - it commits any act or omits to do anything which causes Cambridge any adverse publicity or negative press;
 - (c) it ceases or threatens to cease to carry on business, or is unable to meet its debts as they fall due, has an order made or a resolution passed for its winding-up, has an administrator, receiver or manager appointed or circumstances arise which entitle a court of competent jurisdiction to make such an order in respect of it; or makes any arrangement or composition with its creditors or makes an application to a court of competent jurisdiction for the protection of its creditors in any way; or

- (d) there is a change of control of the Institution.
- 7.2 Without affecting any other right or remedy available to it, Cambridge may terminate this Agreement on giving not less than three (3) months' written notice to the Institution.
- 8. General terms
- 8.1 The terms of this Agreement are governed by English law and subject to jurisdiction of the English courts.
- 8.2 This Agreement is drafted in the English language. If this Agreement is translated into any other language, the English language version shall prevail.
- 8.3 The parties will pay all of their own costs related to the intentions and terms of this Agreement, except as may be otherwise agreed between the parties in writing.
- 8.4 Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as creating a joint venture, partnership, a contract of employment, the relationship of supplier and purchaser or a relationship of principal and agent between the parties.
- 8.5 Neither party shall disclose the terms of this Agreement or make any announcement relating to this Agreement or its subject matter without the prior written approval of the other party.
- 8.6 This Agreement represents the entire agreement of the parties with regard to the use of the Designation and of the Logo and supersedes any prior agreement or discussions with respect to its subject matter.




ORIENTATION PROGRAM FOR FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS - BATCH 2024-27

INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATIONS
















Bhavanites Association- Dr. M.P. Chhava Memorial Lecture Series: Ashish Vidyarthi








Awareness Session and Pledge Ceremony on the Right to Vote










Zephyr: The Literary Society of BVBC organised AAWAZ '25: The Sound of Languages

***** Key Outcomes of the Session


- Students gained awareness about mental health and its importance.



Date :- 10 - March - 205







4. Friesbee





Faculty feedback Analysed: Analysis report-

Faculty members commend the supportive attitude of senior faculty, which fosters a collaborative and encouraging atmosphere. Many noted the overall positive vibes within the institution, contributing to a cohesive work culture. The emphasis on learning, teaching and research is particularly valued, with faculty feeling empowered to engage in innovative methodologies. The college's commitment to organizing conferences and inviting distinguished speakers provides valuable opportunities for professional development and networking. Additionally, cultural celebrations are seen as enriching and enjoyable, further enhancing the sense of community among faculty. The college's location and working environment also receive praise, creating a conducive space for both work and study. Faculty appreciate the time allocated for professional development, allowing them to stay current in their fields. Furthermore, the institution's holistic education approach and its promotion of Sanskrit and Indian values within a modern educational framework resonate positively with faculty members. There is a shared commitment to maintaining high educational standards, which is a source of pride.


Despite these strengths, faculty members have provided several suggestions for improvement. They recommend that the college utilize social media platforms to showcase teacher achievements, enhancing visibility and morale. Additionally, there is a call for salaries to be aligned with established pay scales to ensure fair compensation. Finally, implementing a system for annual appreciation and recognition of faculty contributions would further boost morale and encourage continued excellence.

Action Taken:

In response to faculty feedback, several significant actions have been implemented to enhance the working environment. Desktops with reliable internet access have been provided in every faculty cabin, ensuring that teachers have the necessary tools to support their teaching and research activities effectively. To recognize and appreciate the efforts of faculty members, the college institutionalized the 'Best Teacher Award' in 2022. Originally planned to be awarded in 2025, following the completion of the first batch (2022-2025), the college had decided to initiate the award process based on feedback from second- and final-year students starting in 2024. 'Best Teacher Award 2024' & 'Best Researcher Award 2024' were given in the year 2024 (Annexure 4 (a)) This approach aims to foster a culture of recognition and support for faculty contributions. The college has also taken steps to improve the social media presence. The college is working towards improving the salary structure.

Analysis of Students Feedback

Students appreciate the positive environment fostered within the institution, noting that it contributes significantly to their overall experience. The supportive nature of teachers is frequently mentioned, with many students feeling encouraged and guided in their academic pursuits. Additionally, the college's commitment to hosting good cultural events allows for social interaction and personal growth, fostering a sense of community. Students also emphasized the importance of self-discovery, attributing this to the diverse range of activities and opportunities available. The college's location is seen as advantageous, providing access to resources and a vibrant community.

Practical exposure is another key highlight, with students valuing hands-on experiences that complement their academic learning. Many reported improvements in their communication skills, thanks to various workshops and interactive sessions. There is also a strong interest in more sports activities, as students recognize the importance of physical health alongside academic achievements. Co-curricular activities were praised for enriching the educational experience, while the training and placement services were considered helpful in preparing students for their future careers.

Despite these positive aspects, students have suggested several areas for improvement. There is a demand for more opportunities in arts and crafts, allowing for greater creative expression. Additionally, students expressed concerns regarding the quality of canteen food and have requested enhancements in terms of both quality and variety, as well as affordability. The condition of washrooms was highlighted, with requests for repairs and upgrades to improve hygiene and comfort. Aesthetic improvements, such as graffiti art, were suggested to enhance the visual appeal of the amphitheater and create a more inviting atmosphere.

Action Taken

In response to the feedback provided by students, several initiatives have been implemented to enhance their overall experience. To increase engagement, students have been actively involved in organizing and decorating for various events, which has allowed them to participate in arts and crafts activities such as flower arrangements and board decorations. The Art & Drama Club has also been started. Additionally, the management of the canteen was changed in 2023 to improve food quality and service, addressing students' concerns about variety and affordability. Furthermore, a specific duty has been assigned to regularly monitor the conditions of the washrooms, ensuring that any issues are promptly addressed to enhance hygiene and comfort for all students. These actions reflect the institution's commitment to listening to student feedback and making meaningful improvements.

The institution is currently *not eligible* for NAAC certification, as it was established in the year 2022.

• Organization of Conference
